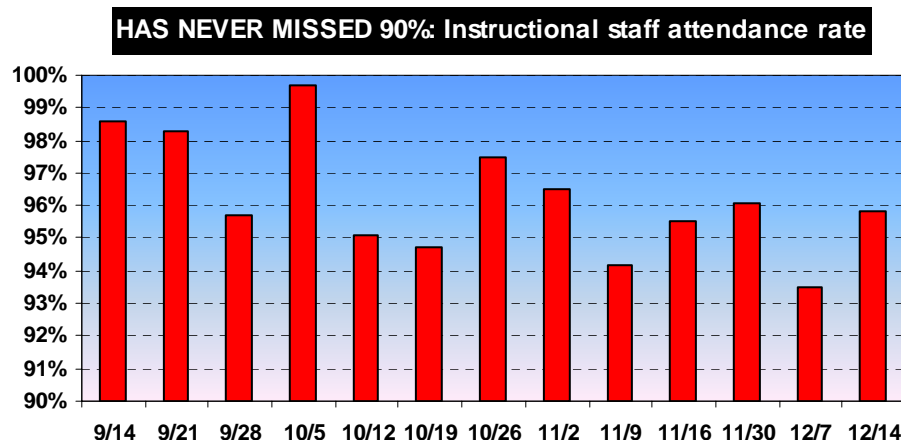

Pineloch Elementary School's *Weekly Service Index* rose 1.6 points this week with mixed results vs. the prior week up and down the line. The *Pineloch Service Index* closed with a reading of 120.6 meaning that overall the school's short-run performance indicators collectively averaged 120.6% of plan.



FIVE DAYS

The chart-of-the-week spotlights the teachers' average weekly attendance rate so far this school year. Not once has it fallen below the 90.0% weekly goal with just one reporting week left in 2007. This is excellent.

The safety patrol count bounced back to a perfect 100% this week...the first time since the week ending Friday, November 9th. This brought the four-week moving average for this measure up to 96%...good work here.

The leadership team did their part again this week with respect to classroom observations. Another 27 walk-throughs were reported on a goal of 10 per week. With the *Partner-in-Education* contact measurement; this is one of the two leading indicators vs. goal-to-date.

Every single one of Pineloch's short-run indicators averaged at least 85% of goal or better, not just on the week, but over the most recent four weeks as well (please see table on page two). This is why all of the indicators' indexes are shaded in yellow or blue. While there were some shortfalls earlier this year in terms of total *Accelerated Reader* tests administered, this issue has been managed. Dr. Choice has to be pleased with the overall standing of 112.3% this late into December (bottom row; far column of table).

How to read the table: The indexes are read as percent-of-goal achieved whereby 100.0 equals exact-to-goal. Principal Anderson established these weekly measures last summer as method for tracking progress against the school's strategic goals during the year. If any indicator has its index shaded in red, then it is performing at less than 85% of goal for that time period. Over time, Edgewater's five-day service indicators should be falling inside the 85.0 to 110.0 range (yellow zone).
