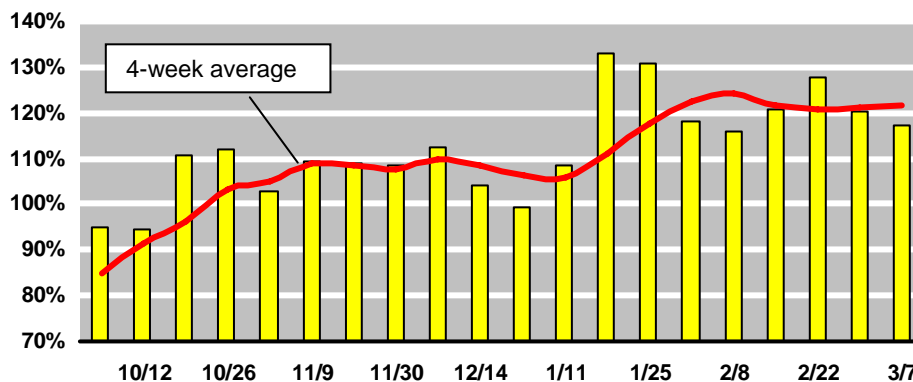

Pineloch Elementary School's *Weekly Service Index* closed the school week off -3.2 points to finish at the 117.1 level on Friday morning. This means that as a group, Dr. Choice's weekly performance indicators managed to reach 117.1% of their goals (chart below).

Percent-of-goal achieved, 16 weekly indicators



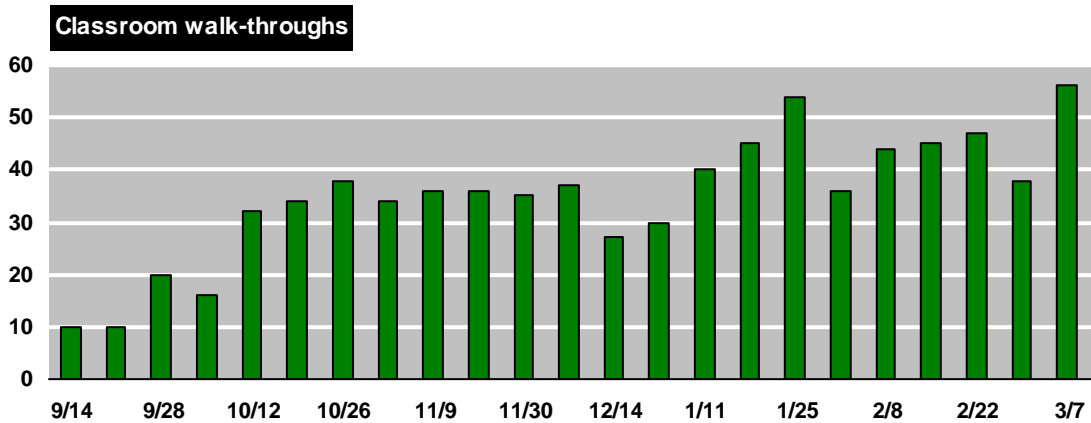
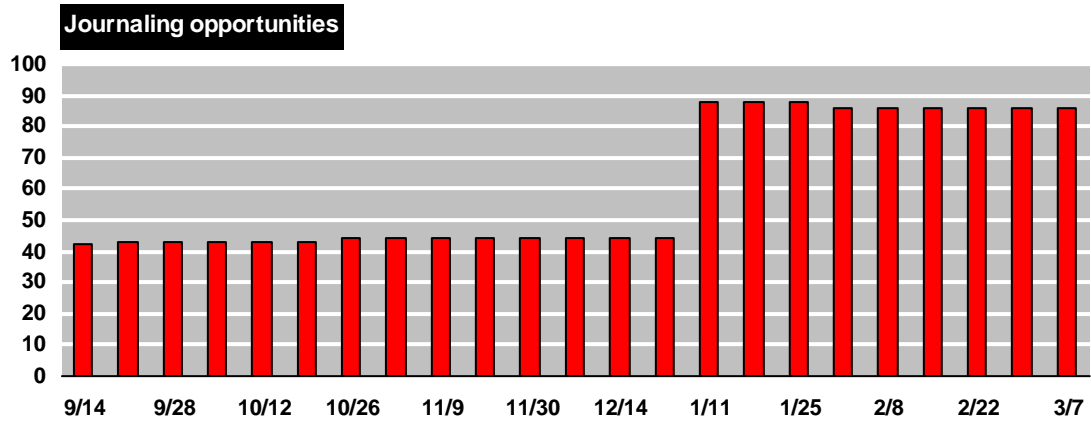
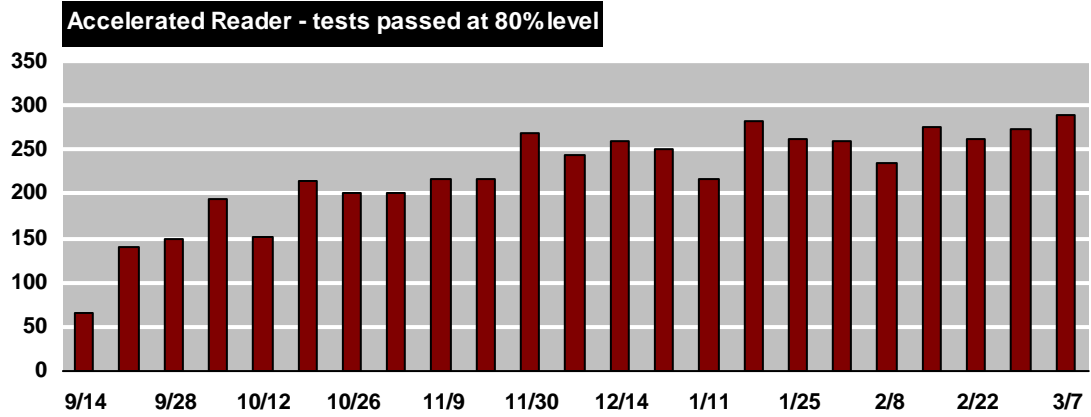
FIVE DAYS – LEADING INTO FCAT

This week was of particular significance in that this was the final full school week before the balance of the 2008 FCAT testing process kicks off on Tuesday. Therefore, the cumulative year-to-date figures in the table on page three are of special value.

The cumulative indexes in the far right column of the table reveal just two Pineloch short-range indicators performing at less than 85% of goal headed into the FCAT. These are *the number of Accelerated Reader tests taken by the students scoring at the 80% level or better* and the *Read Aloud activity* in the primary grades. However, the *Accelerated Reader* year-to-date results if all grades are factored together are running at just over 86% of plan. Moreover, as the top chart on page two illustrates, the teachers have truly amped up their *Accelerated Reader* efforts over recent periods with this week a record 290 tests at the 80% level.

The leadership team also set a record this week in terms of their visibility in the classrooms. A total of 56 *classroom walk-throughs* were conducted on a goal of 20 per week. Great work with superior timing!

How to read the table: The indexes are read as percent-of-goal achieved whereby 100.0 equals exact-to-goal. Principal Choice established these weekly measures last summer as method for tracking progress against the school's strategic goals during the year. If any indicator has its index shaded in red, then it is performing at less than 85% of goal for that time period. Over time, Pineloch's five-day service indicators should be falling inside the 85.0 to 110.0 range (shaded in yellow).
